

Reflections on global challenges and solutions

Over time, priorities for science have successively expanded to the emphasis on global challenges and social, economic, and planetary sustainability. The international scientific community is increasingly making its collective voice heard in confronting the challenges and using the opportunities in ways that serve the sustainability imperative, human welfare, and the global public good. According the Prof. Boulton, it must continue to promote broader public understanding of the issues at stake, work to improve the interface between scientists and policymakers a all levels of governance, an adapt and improve the utility of science systems in supporting beneficial change. Global solutions however require global involvement. It is crucial that the scientific response is inclusive of diverse values, priorities, and approaches.






